You will be contacted within one week of the deadline to learn the status of your student's registration. If a lottery is necessary, you will be notified at this time.

Program Mission

Communication and collaboration in the global marketplace will become increasingly valuable skills for our students as they prepare for college, careers, and citizenship after graduation. In Gwinnett County Public Schools (GCPS), our Dual Language Immersion (DLI) program promises to prepare students for this 21st century reality. Enrollment is voluntary starting with incoming kindergartners and building by one grade level every year.

Program Overview

GCPS' 50/50 Model calls for at least 50% of the school day to be spent learning GCPS' Academic Knowledge and Skills (AKS) curriculum in the new language. A team of two teachers will work together. Students will have mathematics, science, and literacy (specific to the foreign language) with one teacher, using the new language. They will have language arts and social studies with the other teacher, using English. Through this collaboration, students will develop proficiency in both English and the new language.

Eligibility

Priority will be given to students who live in the school's attendance zone (see guidelines #8 & #9 below for exceptions). If more students from the attendance zone apply than there are spaces available, a lottery will be used to determine enrollment. If a lottery is required, it will take place on Monday, May 22, 2017. The lottery will be held beginning at 9:00 a.m. in the 200 building of the school district's Instructional Support Center (ISC) located at 437 Old Peachtree Road, Suwanee, GA in the Collins Hill/Dacula room. Although there is no requirement for parents and students to attend the lottery, the lottery is open to the public. Should a lottery be necessary, your student's registration number (provided by your school) will serve as his or her lottery number. Should the school not receive enough registrations from students within the attendance zone to fill the program, a separate lottery will be held for any students living outside of the attendance zone. This lottery will be held on the same day, immediately following the lottery for students living within the school's attendance zone.

The statements are further described in the separate "Program Guidelines and Parent Understandings" document. Please take the time to read this separate document as well.

1.	Dual Language Immersion registration does not register your student for kindergarten. Kindergarten registration is a separate process. You must register your student for kindergarten at the school for which your child is zoned.
2.	Gwinnett's Dual Language Immersion program requires a long-term commitment on the part of both parents and students to ensure that students get the most benefit from the program. Please remember that space in this program is limited.
3.	Please complete all sections of this registration form and return it to the school offering the immersion program no later than Thursday, May 11, 2017, at 4 p.m. Registration forms must be received (not postmarked) by this date and time. Late forms will not be accepted.
 4.	It is possible that every student registering for this program will not be accepted due to limited space. If more registrations are received than space is available, a lottery will be held of all students whose registration forms were received by the registration deadline. In-zone students receive priority (see guidelines #8 & #9 below for exceptions).
5.	Students living in the school's attendance zone will receive registration priority. If a student is accepted to the program from outside of the attendance zone, transportation will be the responsibility of the parent or guardian. All rules of permissive transfer must be observed.
<u> </u>	If there are an insufficient number of registrants, the program may be cancelled for the upcoming school year.
 7 .	If a lottery is necessary, it will take place on Monday, May 22, 2017 beginning at 9:00 a.m. in the 200 Building of the Instructional Support Center (ISC) located at 437 Old Peachtree Road in Suwanee in the Collins Hill/Dacula room. Although there is no requirement to attend this lottery, the lottery is open to the general public.
8.	At principal and parent discretion, GCPS DLI teacher children and siblings of students enrolled in the program receive priority enrollment.
9.	At principal and parent discretion, In the case of multiples (e.g. twins, triplets), if one student by lottery is enrolled in the program, the multiple sibling receives priority enrollment.
10.	A waiting list will be maintained for both in-zone and out-of-zone students. Waiting lists expire at the end of the kindergarten year.
11.	GCPS' 50/50 Model calls for at least 50% of the school day to be spent learning GCPS' Academic Knowledge and Skills (AKS) curriculum in the new language.
12.	A team of two teachers will work together. Students will have mathematics, science, and literacy (specific to the target language) with one teacher, using the new language. They will have language arts and social studies with the other teacher, using English. Through this collaboration, students will develop proficiency in both English and the new language.
13.	At a determined point during the school day, the teachers will switch groups of students so that all students receive instruction in both English and the target language daily.
14.	There is no additional cost to parents for this program.
15.	This program is wholly voluntary. Dual Language Immersion is only one of many quality educational opportunities available to your student.
16.	Each year, the program will expand to the next grade level as students move through elementary school.
17.	Dual Language Immersion is a very challenging program. A child who is a good listener, flexible, and able to handle transitions is a good candidate for the DLI program. A child who is easily frustrated or has a hard time staying focused may have difficulty with the demands of DLI. Positive support and encouragement from home are important to a child's success in this program.
18.	Most students with disabilities thrive in Dual Language Immersion programs. However, research indicates that those students with poor listening comprehension may not be good candidates for this program. Many of these students have great difficulty

processing sounds into language (including their native language).
